From Wichita:

- Take I-35 North to Exit 92
- Go north on Hwy 177 and follow signs to event site

From Cottonwood Falls:

- Go 7 miles south on Hwy 177 and follow signs to event site

EXPERIENCE A GREEN EVENT

- Bring your refillable water bottle.
- Carpool to the site.
- Pack out items you bring in, including trash and recyclables.

PREPARE TO WALK

- Once you arrive, allow up to one hour to access main event site.
- Wear closed-toed walking shoes.
- Hay wagon rides available to the site.

- Alcoholic beverages. (Purchase beer/wine on site.)
- Glass containers of any kind.
