- Stay on Old K4 Rd. for 5 miles to entrance of site

## **BE PREPARED**

- This remote location requires driving on gravel. Making your way from
  parking to the main site includes walking on the natural terrain of the
  pasture. Please plan accordingly.
- Upon arrival, allow up to one hour to access main event site.
- Wear comfortable closed-toe walking shoes.
- The picturesque walking trail is the best way to access the main event site. If needed, transportation options are available: golf cart rides from the parking area to the ticket gate, and hay wagon rides from the ticket gate to the main event site. Expect long lines.
